LETTER FROM THE EDITOR

ICTs: The Silver Bullet Against the Crisis

According to the European Information Technology Observatory (EITO), the ICTs market worldwide will grow by 5.4% in 2012, provided that industrialized powers overcome the financial crisis. According to Bruno Lamborghini, Chairman of EITO, "neither Japan's tsunami nor political instability in several regions around the world have had a significant impact on global demand for technology, which makes for a positive outlook for the ICTs market worldwide". Emerging markets, such as Brazil, China, India and Russia stand out as those driving the growth expected from this industry globally. Double-digit growth rates have been registered in some cases.

The status quo of ICTs in Europe has improved since 2010, and the European Union software market started to experience its own 'industrial revolution'. Likewise, it has been proven that the effects of the international economic recession on this industry have been modest, compared to others.

According to experts, a new typology of services will be consolidated in 2012, which will define consumption for the next ten years. The digital leap of consumers comes hand in hand with growing mobility, better access to the Internet and greater use of it, all of which fosters a new generation of consumer services. According to the International Data Corporation (IDC), a provider of ICTs market intelligence, companies will operate in a "connected world" in 2012, bearing in mind not only competitors, providers, employees and clients, but also "objects" part of their business processes.

Likewise, the transition and interconnection of traditional corporate applications will accelerate in 2012, giving way to solutions in the cloud. Information Technology in the Net means technology uses applications and services totally based on the Internet, such as the computing software Google Docs or Office 365. There are also more powerful corporate applications, such as data base or security management. Therefore, this field will continue to grow in 2012 and there will be more users transitioning from desktop-based to network-based applications.

It seems this will be a quiet year for the ICTs industry, since the market will report positive data once again, albeit slower paced. However, not all segments will see the same data. For some, such as the hardware segment, the negative trend will continue.

New players have entered the market, mainly supported by their ability to generate huge turnovers and operate at low margins. Most of them come from the e-business field and open-source companies and communities and telecomunication operators. The software market in the Twenty-Seven member countries of the EU will hit €383.5 billion in 2020, which amounts to an annual growth rate of 4.4% from 2008 to 2020. It is slightly below the 5.4% rate experienced by the market globally.

In addition, two very important technical visits are scheduled. The first of them, on March 7, will take us to the Fraunhofer MEVIS Institute, the leading research and development center in computer assistance for image-based medicine. The second of them will take place in the international organization Sennheiser Electronic, an expert in hearing aids, microphones, monitoring and information systems and aviation and audiology products. The secret of this company resides in innovation techniques applied to its products, for which it has been awarded many prizes and patents.

Important Technology Meeting in BITS 2012

BITS (Business IT South America) is CeBIT's spin off targeted at Brazil and Latin America's growing market. The priorities at this event, which will take place this year from May 15 to 17 in Porto Alegre, Brazil, will be ICTs infrastructures for companies, communication services based on B2B meetings, money matters and the public sector.

The Business Meeting AL-INVEST BITS 2012 is an initiative by the National Confederation of Industry (CNI by its Spanish acronym), supported by the Industrial Federation of Rio Grande do Sul (FIERGS by its Portuguese acronym), channeled through its International Business Center (CIN-RS by its Portuguese acronym), in the framework of the AL-INVEST IV program.

The Coordination and Services Consortium of AL-INVEST IV will be present at this symposium offering the ideal framework to organize a Technology Meeting BITS 2012, in collaboration with FIERGS and SOFTSUL.

This meeting will provide Latin American companies with knowledge on the latest technological trends, as shared by European experts with broad experience in the field.

Honduras' FIDE Institution and the Mexican Government know this for sure: strengthening the ICTs sector and taking bold steps to continue growing in international markets is a safe bet. For this, a lot of work, effort and cooperation are necessary.

HONDURAS

Goal: Exports

The Honduran Foundation for Investment and Exports Development (FIDE by its Spanish acronym), works closely with the Honduran Association of Information Technologies (AHTI by its Spanish acronym) seeking to position and promote the Honduran ICTs industry in international markets. The Central American country has 150 companies in this industry, creating more than 7,500 jobs, according to data by Jorge Ghiarelli, President of the AHTI. However, with the local market accounting for 95% of the sales; only 5% of sales are exported.

Vilma Sierra de Fonseca, Executive President of FIDE, said it is "necessary to promote the supply of exportable services and technological and software solutions among international buyers". To do this, FIDE coordinated in 2011 the participation of five Honduran companies in the event Outsource2LAC, which took place in Uruguay. Likewise, the institution will manage, in the framework of the AL-INVEST IV program, the participation of a team of business people to the CeBIT fair, which will take place in Germany next March.


MEXICO

Technological Parks, Clusters and Programs to Promote a Booming Industry









The ICTs sector is one of Mexico's strengths. It has all is necessary to become a key provider in this market worldwide. The North American country has many favorable points, among others, the labor. There are almost 600,000 ICTs professionals in Mexico, and the number is growing, since 65,000 professionals graduate every year.

In the world of Academics, the private and public sectors work closely, coordinating efforts to develop a total of 24 technological parks throughout the country. In addition, there are no less than 23 Information and Communication Technologies Clusters throughout 20 Mexican States.

The Mexican Government acknowledges the economic potential of this industry. Therefore, it is investing all of its energy to make it thrive through programs such as ProSoft, offering financial support for project development and investment. In addition, TechBA was created in 2005, offering several types of financial support, assessment and operational support to Mexican companies. Finally, MexicolT promotes the Latin American country as the ideal center to establish ICTs companies.

Mercosur, Chile and Venezuela

URUGUAY

Business Rounds and Development Programs to Promote ICTs

The Uruguayan Chamber of Information Technologies (CUTI by its Spanish acronym) and the Chamber of Industry of Uruguay (CIU by its Spanish acronym), supported by the AL-INVEST IV program, put together the mvdBIZIT Business Round in Montevideo, a meeting of the highest representatives and businesspeople of the ICTs industry in Latin America. More than 80 companies participated in the event, where more than 200 business meetings were scheduled.

Likewise, the AL-INVEST IV program, in collaboration with the Chamber of Industry of Uruguay, organizes the Development Program for New Exporters in the ICTs industry. It offers assessment to interested companies on the internationalization process.

ICTs in the Health and Tourism Industries

Two Uruguayan companies in the ICTs industry have closed business deals. On the one hand, EviMed SRL, which offers training for health-care providers, has closed several business deals. The Latin American country has re-shaped the pattern of sponsored courses for health-care providers, and six activities more have been scheduled for 2012.

On the other hand, the company CDEV SRL, divided its operations into two businesses, as a result of the strategic and internationalization process. The spin offs are SEGUROS and Booking Force, an online application to book hotels.

The success of Booking Force caught the attention of other companies in the industry, and a strategic agreement was concluded with another business association supplying complementary software to the hotel industry. Thanks to this new software business unit, new business deals have been closed in Argentina and Uruguay.
